
The Big 5

The Big Five was developed by an American National Reading Panel in 1999.

The National Reading Panel's analysis made it clear that pupils need a systematic approach to develop the necessary skills to make sense of print to develop the skills needed for reading comprehension.



- 1. Phonemic awareness: recognising individual sounds make up words
- 2. Phonics and decoding use of the relationship between letters and spoken sounds to decode and blend words
- 3. Fluency: reading at an appropriate speed with accuracy and expression.
- 4. Vocabulary: knowing the meaning and pronunciation of words
- 5. Comprehension: understanding the meaning of the text
